Notes from the Editor



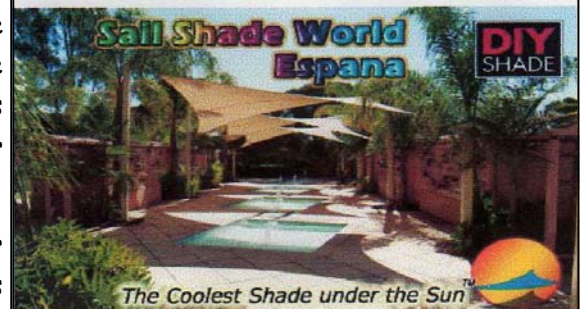

Rules of Golf—Illustrated

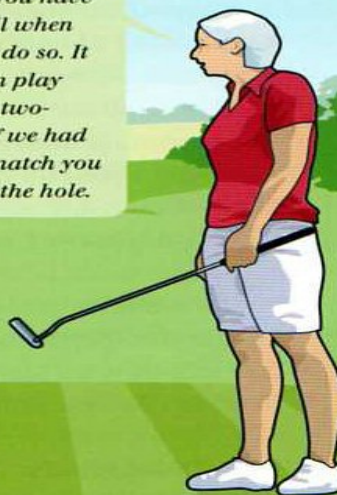


Playing a substituted ball

I lifted my ball from the putting green to clean it, but I have just noticed that I have played the other ball I had in my pocket.



Unfortunately, you have substituted a ball when not permitted to do so. It is now the ball in play and you incur a two-stroke penalty. If we had been playing a match you would have lost the hole.

Golfing News.....Local Rules at Los Moriscos...revisited!

All the established rules of golf according to the Royal & Ancient apply, plus the following :-

WINTER RULES apply from the 1st of October until the 30th April. You may mark, lift, clean and replace within a six inch 'D', no nearer the hole.

FENCES & WALLS If your ball lands the other side of a fence or boundary wall it is out-of-bounds and you incur a two shot penalty. Play a provisional ball from the place you struck the original ball.

BUGGY PATHS (Concrete or Dirt). Should your ball end up on a buggy path you are allowed a **free drop**, stance plus one club length, no nearer the hole.

DITCH HOLES: 2, 16, 17, 18 If your ball ends up in a drainage ditch the other side of the buggy path, **NO RELIEF** is allowed. Either play the ball as it lies, or take a penalty drop.

Hole 3: The groups of palm trees on the right hand side of the fairway, are now considered established - No Free Drop.

Water holes: 5, 6, 7, 13, 14 & 16 Any ball clearing the water hazard but then rebounding into water incurs a one shot penalty. The second ball should be played, observing line of entry, with the original hazard between ball and green.

Hole 7: Should the ball lie behind the netting, which protects the green from the 8th tee, it may be lifted to the nearest point of relief, no nearer the hole.

Hole 9: If the ball lands on the path between the fence and the wall at the end of the Ladies tee, a free drop - as it lies, is permitted from the Ladies tee.

Hole 11: A free drop (one club length), is permitted should your ball land in the young hibiscus plants that line both right and left hand sides of the fairway. Should your ball end up in the tunnel or towards the 12th tee, it is out-of bounds.

Hole 15: A free drop is permitted should your ball land in the drainage stones on the left hand side of the fairway, stance plus one club length, no nearer the hole.

Hole 16: Ditch on the left GUR (ball may be lifted without penalty, to the nearest point of relief no nearer the hole). Ditch to the right, see above.

Hole 17: Ditch on the left GUR. Ditch to the right is now a half pipe, with a white line. Therefore, if your ball lands on the other side, or is in the hedge, it is **out of bounds**.

Hole 18: Path on the left is no longer a buggy path, over the fence is out-of bounds. Ditch to the right, see above.

At least one player in your group should carry an R & A handbook, ask your GINS Rep. for a free copy. Please familiarize yourself with some of the basic rules.

How to Recover from a bad shot!

Great players are able to overcome a bad shot, but most casual players don't know how to do this. What happens? You hit one bad shot then panic. You get outside your level of comfort. Your muscles tighten up, your swing gets shorter and faster, and all of a sudden,

you've got an 8 on your scorecard.

Most pro golfers are able to recover from one mistake. It takes discipline. They stay in the present, try their hardest on every shot, and forget what's already happened.

Try to get into a good routine before every shot. A big deep breath helps you relax while you're planning the shot. Never hit a shot with which you're not comfortable.

For example, if you're faced with a long shot over water and you're not sure you can carry it, be safe and play around it. If you're deep in the woods, chip the ball back onto the fairway instead of trying to slash it through the woods. Make sure you use enough club on every shot and make a smooth swing. Most casual players underclub and

overswing.

Poor shots can't be eliminated, the effects of them can be managed better. This was one of my problems... is it yours?
